## THE GIFT OF COMMUNITY REFLECTIONS ON 2024'S IMPACT

Throughout 2024, you have generously given your time, talents, and treasures to over 660 vulnerable children in our community. These children, through no fault of their own, have faced incredibly difficult times. Yet, because of your care, they have experienced moments of joy, connection, and healing.

As I reflect on this year, I am overwhelmed by the smiling faces and moments of excitement your generosity has made possible. Through your efforts, these children feel seen, loved, and valued. Their stories now include redemptive memories and joyful experiences every child deserves.

Take Johnny, for example. He dedicated his time (and his truck) to deliver bikes—special gifts for children who won them at the Foster Family Fun Day. Watching their laughter and excitement as they received their bikes was a heartwarming reminder of how small acts can create profound joy.

Or consider the 94 volunteers who came together to host a special Christmas party for families navigating separation. One unforgettable moment was seeing a father's smile as his child, temporarily removed from his care, hugged him after handing him a gift selected in "Santa's Workshop." These moments of connection and love are transformative, not only for the families but for everyone involved.

This year, our community has shared their gifts in remarkable ways:

**TIME:** Volunteers have given the gift of their time, pouring 4,475 hours into hosting shoppers, delivering essential items, playing with kids at special events, and being a steady presence for children in need.

**TALENTS:** Many have shared the gift of their unique skills to build furniture, audit inventory, organize events, and create opportunities for children to thrive.

**TREASURES:** Donations have provided the gift of needed items such as clothing, car seats, and Christmas and birthday presents, ensuring children have what they need and wish for. Financial contributions have funded programs and services that make a significant difference in their lives.

Your kindness has done more than meet immediate needs. It has shown these children they are cherished and never alone. Every smile and laugh is a testament to the love you have shared.

As you reflect on the impact we've made together, I encourage you to continue sharing your time, talents, and treasures in the year ahead. Whether by volunteering, donating, or spreading the word, your involvement creates lasting change. #### foster parents' night out

In 2024, six Foster Parents' Night Out events were hosted in Lane County. On average, 43 children joined us per event for an evening of themed FUN while resource parents enjoyed time to refresh. In total, 765 respite hours were provided and 29 families were served.

### peer 生家 mentorship

Peer Mentorship is a 12-week, oneon-one relational pairing between an experienced Resource Parent (Mentor) and a newer Resource Parent (Mentee). Peer Mentorship offers a unique space for supportive conversations while facilitating guided discussions through a book and discussion packet. Seven Mentors and six Mentees participated in Lane County cohorts in 2024.





The My Community program connects caring community volunteers with relative resource (foster) families in need of support. Volunteer teams come alongside families to offer tangible and intangible care through meals, random acts of kindness, and encouragement! In 2024, we piloted three groups, supporting relative placement resource families. This program will continue to grow in 2025.

This is one of the many ways we collaborate closely with the Oregon Department of Human Services to support families. This partnership creates a network of care, giving families comfort and reassurance, knowing their community is here to support them during challenging times.







There is a real and pressing need for safe and loving homes for local kids in foster care. We are always recruiting caring community members to invite children into their home. If you are interested in learning more about becoming a resource (foster) parent, we will walk with you as you explore whether foster care is the right choice for you and your family.

Every Child Lane County held 6 recruitment events and provided information on the first steps to becoming a certified resource parent to 133 inquiring community members in 2024.
